Book discussion questions

- 1. One of the settings for this story is Fremont, NE even though the main character lives in Omaha. How is the setting of the story important? Why do you think the author chose it?
- 2. The author's previous stories are based on the Seven Deadly Sins. Which sin(s), if any, do you believe the author focused on in this story? Why do you believe that?
- 3. The author has said that she believes the Seven Deadly Sins are the basis for every crime. Do you believe this is true? Why or why not?
- 4. Dez hasn't worked on her sister's case for a long time. In fact, she's been avoiding it.

 Why is she motivated to help Tamara with a cold case that is bound to stir up negative memories for herself? What does this tell you about Dezeray Jackson?
- 5. Dez is compelled to find her sister's killer and says that she'll "take a few souvenirs" herself. What do you think she should do if she finds him/her? What's motivating her actions? Fear? Anger? Loss? Something else?
- 6. The main character, Dezeray Jackson, insists that she wants a normal, easy-going relationship with a man. Why do you think she can or can't have one?
- 7. It's clear that Dez has feelings for all of the men in her life. If you were going to choose Dez's life partner, who would you choose and why? Patrick Murphy, Scott James, or Haithem Nazari?
- 8. Scott James isn't who he claims to be. How would you handle his betrayal?
- 9. Which supporting character(s) do you like the most and why?
- 10. Which supporting character(s) did you like the least and why?
- 11. What was your favorite/least favorite scene in the book?
- 12. What is Dez's fatal flaw?
- 13. Describe the story in one word? Why did you choose that word?
- 14. This is the first book in a series. How likely are you to read the next one? Why or why not?
